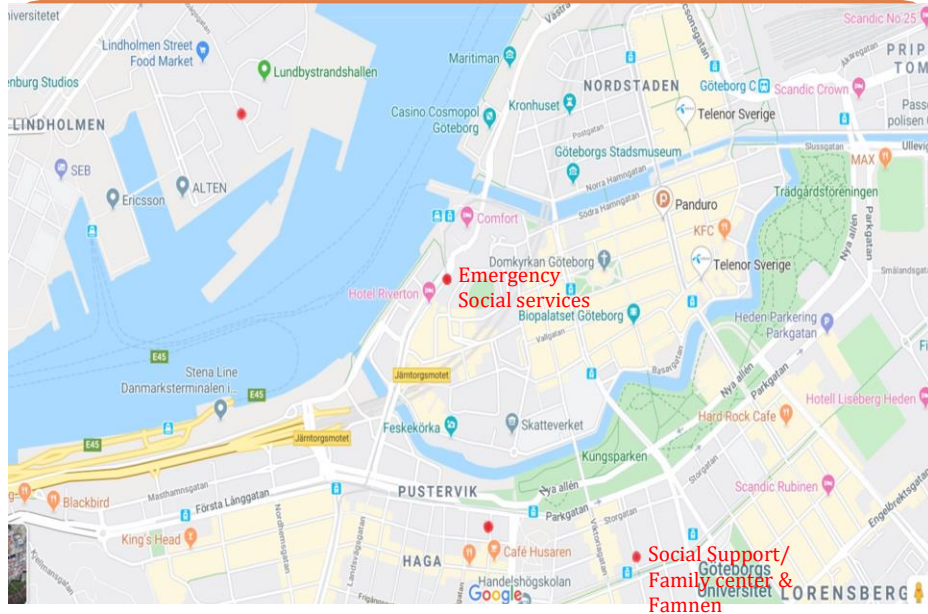

To consider when you're outdoors

In Sweden we have the right of public access to nature and land, also in areas which others own. This right comes with responsibilities. You may pitch two or three tents for a night or two, but for a longer time or with multiple tents you must have the landowner's permission. You must also get permission to park caravans on a private road.

There are often fire bans during dry weather in the summer. You are not allowed to lit any fire outside during this ban. At other times it is allowed to light a fire if you do it with great care make sure the fire is put out.

It is forbidden to throw or leave trash behind. Shattered glass, empty tins, plastic or other debris can injure both people and animals and is therefore forbidden

To live and stay in Gothenburg

As an EU citizen you are entitled to study, work or simply live in Sweden without a residence permit for a period of up to three months, as are your family members.

After three months in Sweden, as an EU-citizen you are entitled to continued right of residence without a residence permit if you have work, are self-employed or actively seeking work.

You and any family members that are residing in Sweden must have sufficient financial resources to support yourselves.

If you do not meet the requirements for right of residence, you are not entitled to assistance except for in an emergency situation.

Social Support / Family Center

Offers opportunity to have a breakfast, to take shower and to wash your clothes. You can also get information about social issues and about the Swedish society. They can inform you about your rights to healthcare and emergency dental health if you are without documentation.
